Additionally, staff from each location were asked to suggest safety rules for Aradel Holdings Plc, which will be streamlined and cataloged by Aradel's excellent group of graduate trainees for implementation companywide.

In his address to staff, Aradel Chief Executive Officer/MD, Mr. Adegbite Falade, said, 'In all we do at Aradel, let us always proceed at the speed of safety.
